



Fees and Charges 2023

Annual Fees

The **Annual Composite Fee for 2023 is \$10,472** and covers compulsory costs including:

- equipment, consumable materials and other resources supplied for all subjects
- compulsory camps, excursions and retreats.

An amount equal to 25% of the Annual Composite Fee is billed as a Re-enrolment Fee and is payable in full by 28 November 2022. Payment of the Re-enrolment Fee confirms your daughter's continuing enrolment and is **non refundable**. The balance of the Annual Composite Fee is due in three equal instalments payable 28 February, 28 May and 28 August 2023.

The **Annual Technology Levy for 2023 is \$278** and is compulsory for all Year 7 to Year 12 students and is payable on 28 February 2023. It covers ICT services including the provision of an Individual Notebook or other computing device, designated software and network support, and printing and Internet access up to the set quota (students are charged where these quotas are exceeded).

Fees Discounts

Family Discount

Families with 2, 3 or 4 students concurrently attending the College will receive a discount of 10%, 20% or 30% respectively off the Annual Composite Fee.

Early Payment

An Early Payment discount of \$250 per student applies if all fees and charges are paid on or before 28 February 2023.

Compassionate Discount

Parents experiencing financial hardship can apply for a fee reduction. Applications are to be made in writing to the Principal. Application forms are available from the Accounts Receivable Office.

Health Care Card Holders

Holders of a valid means-tested Health Care Card (includes Pensioner, Foster Parent or Veterans Affairs Concession Cards) may be eligible for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) funding. Card holders are asked to forward a copy to

the College to enable us to apply for CSEF funding to be allocated directly towards your school fee account.

Families with a valid Health Care Card will also be eligible for a \$500 per student low income discount.

Payment

All Families are required to pay their fees via Direct Debit.

Alternative Payment Options

Parents may elect to pay their school fee account in 10 monthly instalments or 20 fortnightly instalments starting November 2022. Families experiencing financial difficulty may apply for an alternative payment schedule on an annual basis through the Accounts Receivable Office. *Families with existing alternative arrangements are requested to contact the College in November 2022 to renew their arrangements.*

Additional Fees and Charges

OLMC Building Fund – Annual Appeal

All families are asked to contribute \$300 per year to the OLMC Building Fund. This is a voluntary donation and as such is tax deductible. This contribution is essential for ongoing capital works.

Special Subject Fees

Private music and singing lessons, some externally provided VET courses, non-compulsory excursions, and designated activities that attract additional fees will be billed separately and are payable as advised.

Miscellaneous Items

Items such as calculators, books, eBook subscriptions, music and exam booklets, padlocks provided by the College and externally provided VET course materials attract additional charges, are billed separately and are payable as advised.

College-provided high security padlocks (\$40 each) and Notebook Slip Covers (\$40) are compulsory for all students. These items are student property however the Notebook remains the property of the College.

New Enrolment Fees

Families applying for enrolment at OLMC are required to pay an Enrolment Application Fee of \$80. This is payable at the time of application and is not refundable. A non-refundable Confirmation of Enrolment fee (\$750 in 2023) is payable on Acceptance. Of this amount, \$500 is deducted from the student's Annual Composite Fee in their first year at OLMC.
